Relax, Release, Recognize, and Restore

*Blessed are those who trust in the Lord,
whose trust is the Lord.
They shall be like a tree planted by water,
sending out its roots by the stream.
It shall not fear when heat comes,
and its leaves shall stay green;
in the year of drought it is not anxious,
and it does not cease to bear fruit. (Jeremiah 17:7-8 NRSV)*

*"But blessed is the man who trusts me, God,
the woman who sticks with God.
They're like trees replanted in Eden,
putting down roots near the rivers—
Never a worry through the hottest of summers,
never dropping a leaf,

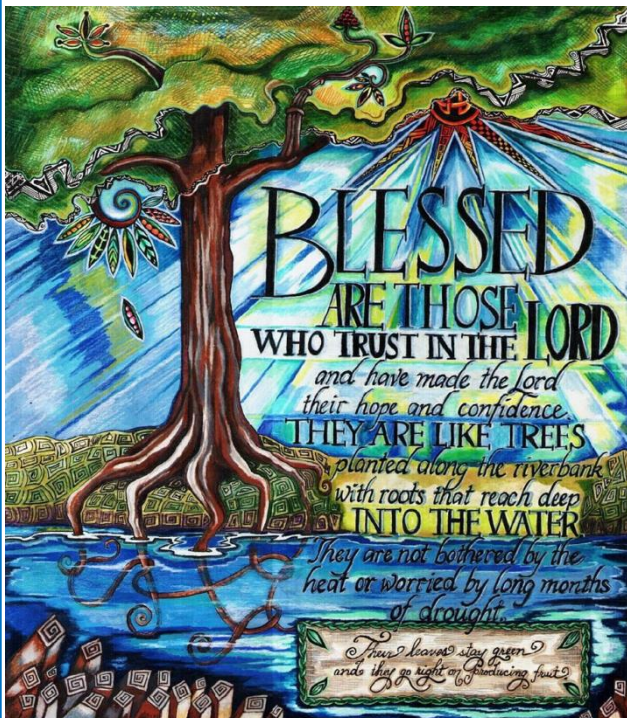
This past year, with Covid 19, transferring to a new church and the difficulties of getting to know one another deeply from a distance, the kids and I living through a divorce, the ups and downs with my health, and yes, even losing one puppy I loved and getting a new puppy I love, have been a refining fire. The heat has been intense, not just personally, but in ministry as well.

There have been times I have felt like, and if I admit it to myself, I have been a failure. Yet, these verses pay no mind to that. Failure, struggle, hardship is par for the course. It's how we respond to those obstacles that define who we are and whose we are. Yes, there have been moments when I wanted to walk away, to give up, to tell God, this challenge is just too difficult. Yet, somehow, some way, God would turn my eyes back to these words.

Thank you to everyone who filled out our first survey. We had approximately 60 responses. (And it's not too late ... if you didn't participate and would like to, please contact Abby Fleming or the church office.) Much of the insight we gained was from the comments included within the survey but we did want to share some of the key takeaways with you.

- More than 85% of respondents indicated they serve the church in at least one capacity (something in addition to attending worship).
- Approximately 45% of respondents said they would be willing to do something additional for the church if they could find the right fit. However, less than 40% of people said they'd been personally asked to serve in a new way. We know this means we need to provide better visibility into our open needs but also personally invite people to serve.
- Approximately 40% of respondents indicated they were involved in a growth group currently (or at least pre-COVID). Approximately 12% of respondents said they'd never been part of a growth group. Jill Sestok, Director of Spiritual Formation, will continue to develop our growth group program to make sure that everyone has a way to feel connected to the church through a growth group.
- Almost 50% of the respondents indicated they were retired. Many of the comments around ways to be involved in our community included comments about reaching out to younger families. We know that this is an area we'll need to work on (and it might mean some changes!) in order to maintain our current congregation and also to grow in the future.

There were lots of comments and ideas presented. This was a helpful tool for us to gather information and ideas. However, please remember that if we don't immediately implement your idea, it's not that we didn't listen. Sometimes we had conflicting ideas and we have to look for which initiatives help us best fulfill our mission and vision. Considering all of the ideas and comments within the survey will be an ongoing project that will take months/years but it's all part of moving forward to best help us make disciples. We are now looking at our second survey related primarily to worship. As we look ahead to a time where we aren't limited by the COVID-19 pandemic for worship, we'd like to get some feedback on worship in the past and ideas going forward. The survey will be sent out electronically. Hard copies will also be available in the church office.

Would you like to offer your creations as gifts to those who are recovering from illness, have lost a loved one, or are new parents in the community? Would you love to pass on your craft to the next generation? Then imagine your creation being prayed over by the faith community at BFUMC prior to being offered as caring hugs to those in need.

In the midst of planning a ministry for those who are grieving, this idea of having a group make lap quilts, afghans, or crocheted throws for those in need bubbled up. This is a ministry for those within the BFUMC family but also for those the BFUMC family know and love who are in need. As the discussion deepened, the idea of offering either blankets or booties to new parents arose as well as this being an opportunity for a multi-generational gathering where veteran crafters mentored the next generation.

The Missions Team has reserved a Dragon Boat and is looking for participants to race this boat during the Belleville Lake Fest June 26 and 27, 2021. We hope to do some work for Cass Community Social services this summer - opportunities are developing with 5 new tiny houses being built and also at the new building that Cass has purchased to turn into a family shelter. I would also like to thank Debbie Smith and Joyce Forest for being here faithfully every Wednesday to distribute bags. We have two new volunteers this month - Lisa and Kelley Young! Donna Collins and Mark Groeneweg continue to help with shopping. Thank you! Donna has also been taking food that our clients don't select that we receive from the VB township senior center to a homeless shelter in Monroe. I would like to thank all of our volunteers who donate their time to help feed the hungry in our community! We couldn't function without you! Additionally, we are keeping Doug Cook in our prayers and wishing him a speedy recovery from a broken collar bone after being hit by a car while riding his bicycle in early April. Doug has been helping with unloading and shelving large food deliveries.

Food Closet Banners!

If you haven't been by the church recently, we now have two 4x8 foot banners out to advertise the Emergency Food Closet. One is at the entrance to the parking lot and the other is on the corner of Roys and Church street. A BIG thank you goes out to Mark and Dee Groeneweg for installing them. The one at Roys and Church street has a solar floodlight that lights up at night for all to see. Since their installation, it has brought us a few more clients!

Our volunteers have placed Emergency Food Closet brochures at 11 different establishments throughout the area to notify anyone who may be in need of food. Within Van Buren and Sumpter Townships and the City of Belleville, there are 15 different locations that distribute food with all days and times of day included except Monday. For those that need food on Monday, our Little Free Food Pantry located on Charles and the Community Cupboard on Main St. are available and are replenished regularly.

January-April Numbers

467 bags of food have been distributed with 26 new clients. Easter week we distributed regular bags, refrigerator, personal care items and a \$20 Food Only Meijer gift card to be used as needed. Since April 13, due to the generosity of our church family and the community, we are distributing a \$20 Food Only Meijer gift card on a weekly basis to clients so that they may purchase fresh fruits, vegetables and additional food.

Bottle/Can Drive

Steve Dolot is continuing to pick up bottles and cans on Wednesdays. To date he has submitted over \$800 to the EFC and has another \$500 to \$1,000 coming by June. Recycling the containers slowed for awhile for the stores have been overwhelmed with recycling but things are improving!

Winter Simply Give Campaign A HUGE Success!

\$11,210 was raised locally and \$10,000 was donated by Meijer for a total of \$21,210! The Spring Simply Give Campaign runs through July 3. June 19th is the only double match day. If we can raise \$5,000 on this date, Meijer will match with \$10,000

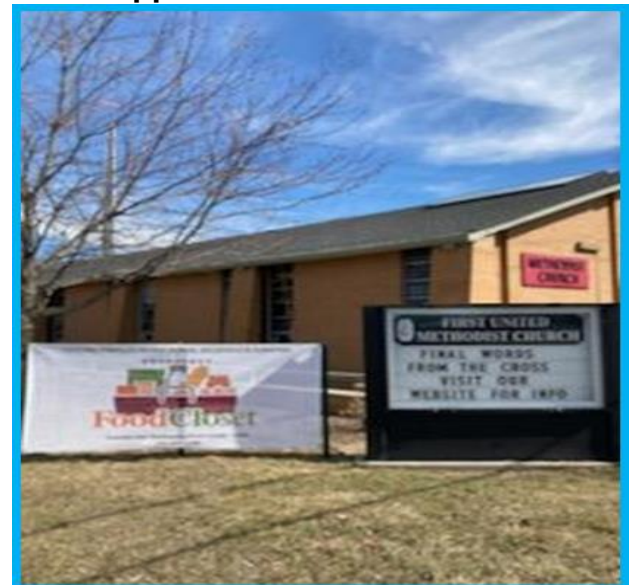
God's Closet
